Grants for Faculty and Departments. These grants are offered annually or as funding allows.

Classroom Observations. CTL consultants will conduct <u>classroom observations</u> for faculty who wish to analyze their classroom teaching behaviors or their presentation skills and discuss teaching improvement goals and strategies.

Online Course or Module Reviews. <u>CTL consultants are available to review</u> and provide feedback on a section of your online course or to perform a more in-depth review of your online or hybrid course.

Mid-Semester Student Feedback. <u>Student focus groups</u> facilitated by CTL consultants can provide you with feedback about what is working well and what could be improved in your course. Alternatively, mid-term student feedback can be collected using an <u>online survey</u>. Our consultants can work with you to tailor an online survey to meet your individual needs.
